Sermon Series

The women at the empty tomb experienced the ultimate surprise discovering the Lord had Risen, indeed! This element of the surprise of God continues throughout our biblical story. Worship Music

Glorious Things of Thee Are Spoken

This text in praise of the church is by John Newton. It is based on Isaiah 33:20-21 and gives a general notion of the state of the redeemed in the kingdom of God. The hymn first appeared in the *Olney Hymns* (1779), the result of a collaborative effort between Newton and William Cowper. John Newton is best known for writing the hymn *Amazing Grace*, *How Sweet the Sound*. AUSTRIAN HYMN was composed by Franz Joseph Haydn.

Help Us Accept Each Other

This text by Fred Kaan was inspired by a Bible study written for the Cumberland Presbyterian Church by Mrs. Jackie Mattonen. Mrs. Mattonen served for several years as a member of the Executive Committee of the World Alliance of Reformed Churches, for which Kaan served as staff from 1968 to 1978. Several biblical references are present in the hymn: Romans 15:7 in verse 1, John 3:21, Ephesians 4:15, and Matthew 18:21 in verse 3.

BARONITA was composed by Doreen Potter in 1975 especially for this text in *Break Not the Circle* (1975). According to Kaan, the appearance of this hymn in *Cantate Domino* (1980 occurred only after copyright clearance could not be obtained for another hymn. He writes, "It so happened that my "Hymn on acceptance" was just of the right length to fill the two blank pages that needed filling." This hymn was used by Church Women United in the 1983 World Day of Prayer service.

To God Be the Glory

This hymn was written by Fanny Crosby for children. She titled it "Praise for Redemption." It was published in William H. Doane and Robert Lowry's *Brightest and Best* (1875). The hymn was all but forgotten until Cliff Barrows was gathering materials for the Billy Graham Greater London Crusade in 1954. Someone suggested this hymn. It became a favorite of the Crusade and subsequently the hymn was reintroduced to the United States in the 1954 Nashville Crusade held at Vanderbilt University. The text differs from other Crosby gospel hymns in that it has an objective rather than subjective nature. TO GOD BE THE GLORY was composed for this text by William Howard Doane for *Brightest and Best* (1875).

Praise God, from Whom All Blessings Flow

This form of the Doxology was written by Neil Weatherhogg in 1988. The first published form of the text was in *The Presbyterian Hymnal - Hymns, Psalms, and Spiritual Songs* (1990). It is an inclusive language versification originally used by the congregation of Harvey Browne Memorial Presbyterian Church, Louisville, Kentucky, where he is pastor and head of staff. This is the first published form of the text.

Worship Art

The children of our church are learning about the liturgical seasons by exploring worship art. The butterflies in worship this morning were crafted by our children. Although butterflies in the Bible aren't mentioned explicitly, their lifecycle is a remarkable illustration from nature of the transforming work of Jesus Christ in the lives of believers.

"Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here!" (2 Corinthians 5:17, NLT)

The word transform is *metamorpheo* in Greek, from which we get the English term metamorphosis. It describes the type of change a caterpillar undergoes to become a butterfly. The same word is used to explain Christ's transfiguration. The idea conveys a radical change or complete transformation. At Jesus' transfiguration, his physical appearance was temporarily metamorphosed from an ordinary human to a divine being in all his glory.

"As the men watched, Jesus' appearance was transformed so that his face shone like the sun, and his clothes became as white as light." (Matthew 17:2, NIV)


