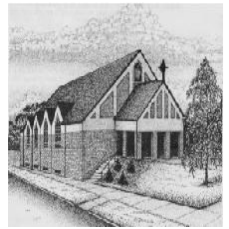

**"Fasting for Lent"**  
By Judy Davis

In the 58th Chapter of Isaiah, the Israelites ask Isaiah and God: "Why do we fast and you don't see; why afflict ourselves and you don't notice?" *Isaiah 58:3*

Isaiah is quick to tell them that their fasting has been misdirected. They have fasted for their own pleasure and forgotten their workers. He instructs them in what a true fast should consist of:  
*"Isn't this the fast I choose: releasing wicked restraints, untying the ropes of a yoke, setting free the mistreated, and breaking every yoke? Isn't it sharing your bread with the hungry and bringing the homeless poor into your house, covering the naked when you see them, and not hiding from your own family?" Isaiah 58:6-7*

For me, Lent brings back childhood memories of fasting: giving up chocolate, but gorging myself on caramel. Once in high school, I gave up cigarettes and ended up buying a pipe and some tobacco. Surely my understanding of Lent was as misdirected as it was for the Israelites. I wanted to be good. I wanted to prove to Mama and God that I could sacrifice for the sake of good, and I failed miserably.

So, today, I, like the Israelites, ask God, "Just what is it that you want? How would you have me spend these 40 days leading up to Easter?" I cry with the psalmist
