Greetings FPC Family!

Grace to you and peace from God the Father and our Lord, Jesus Christ! I hope and pray this January 2019 newsletter finds you happy and well! The First Presbyterian Church family of faith is very blessed by each and every one of you!!

The radio stations are back to playing "regular" music. Santa Claus and Elf on the Shelf have returned to the North Pole. Trash cans are overflowing with bits and pieces of boxes and wrapping paper. Christmas is now behind us ... or is it?

Well, it isn't! We now find ourselves directly in the "thick" of Christmas! Christmas proclaims that God has come in flesh, has come "to save us all from Satan's power." Christmas celebrates far more than a

birthday; Christmas acclaims the advent of messianic salvation. Christ was sent among us in order to save us...

What we pay homage to at Christmas, therefore, is that the ultimate fulfillment of God's saving purpose begins with the birth of Jesus, the messianic Savior. God's only Son is born among us in order to save the world. This is the message of Christmas.

From the beginning of time, God's saving purpose has been at work. God has raised up the seed of Abraham, including Moses and Gideon and Samson and John the Baptist. Through all these generations, God has been faithfully at work raising persons to bring us the Davidic Messiah, the messianic King, the Son of the Most High who will ascend the throne of David. Through all of human history, God has been bringing forth Jesus Christ. Now through the birth of the Savior, God's purpose will be fulfilled. God has acted to save God's people. The Christ child is born for the saving of the world.

So don't stop celebrating Christmas! Christmas has just begun! And, it's just like Kris Kringle says, "Christmas isn't just a day, it's a frame of mind!" (from the Miracle on 34th Street (1947)). May everyone keep Christmas alive and well ... this week, next week, in all of 2019, and beyond!!

December Session Highlights

The following items were acted upon at the December Session Meeting:

- The December 9th stated session meeting included 14 members in attendance with 3 members absent. FPC Youth Director Dan Walden and The Rev. Steven Barnes (moderator) were also in attendance.
- A Motion to approve Michael Thompson and John McCarthy for the 2019 Nominating Committee was made by Doug Bolton, seconded by Cheryl Meichsner and approved by common consent.
- Christian Education reported that Sunday School attendance was low but that Elder Training/Presbyterian 101 classes have been well attended. The team will be looking to build a new model for education in 2019.

- Welcoming and Evangelism discussed possibility of using church van to pick up people at Merryvale and the need to pick up other members of the church.
- The Motion to approve the 5 elders brought forth from the 2018 Nominating committee was made by Doug Bolton, seconded by Michael Thompson and approved through common consent.
- A Motion to approve John McCarthy as Clerk of Session, Michael Thompson as Assistant Clerk of Session and Peni Kehoe as Treasurer for 2019 was made by Doug Bolton, seconded by Stephanie Scarborough and approved by common consent.


