

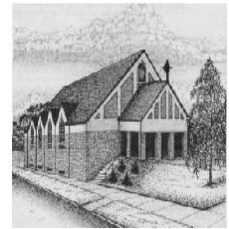

## CALL TO CONFESSION
